1. Welcome

Chair Neil Stanbury welcomed everyone to the meeting and introduced key Fremantle Ports staff. Apologies were noted. Neil outlined the terms of reference for the Group, the purpose, term, membership and roles and responsibilities and invited comment.

2. Community relations

Neil presented an overview of the business, Fremantle Ports' strategic priorities and community support for:

- Koorliny Arts Centre Exhibition Zone.
- Gold member of Rockingham/Kwinana Chamber of Commerce and sponsor of forthcoming Business Awards

- Kwinana Hockey Club - Tigers sponsorship
- OMG Fringe - City of Kwinana sponsorship

3. Port Operations

Andrew Hathaway gave an overview of the KBT and KBJ facilities and Port Operations:

- Westport update and discussion around the State Government intention to relocate the container trade to Kwinana at some future point.
- Latest statistical information on Outer Harbour operations and performance, including KBT and KBJ vessel wait times.
- COVID response - update on protocols put in place by Fremantle Ports and success of these to date.
- Safety's importance in port operations.
- An update on environment initiatives by the organization, including the Inner Harbour Fairy Tern sanctuary and measures taken at the Outer Harbour.

4. Trade update

Sean Mulhall gave a trade update focused on KBT and KBJ facilities and operations:

- Import/Export capabilities, rail receipt and multi-product facilities, stevedoring, bulk services, asset maintenance and stockpiles
- Explained the range of KBT imports and exports, including cement clinker, nut coke, gypsum, liquefied petroleum gas, iron ore, silica sands and bauxite
- KBT and KBJ tonnages to date
- Overview of KBJ services
- KBJ imports and exports including gypsum, potash, ammonia, slag, caustic soda, soya bean meal, petroleum, phosphates, sulphur and urea and exports Silica sands, ammonium nitrate and sulphuric acid.

5. General business

- Kateryna Longley expressed her delight in having the opportunity to be part of the group and hoped to bring a balanced view, promoting the softer side of social psychology and building with nature during any future port development.
- Tom Perrigo said he was keen to understand how the group could contribute to the Inner Harbour planning and also requested copies of the presentations given.
- Kateryna gave an example of the Port of Rotterdam being a source of community pride and embedding this in the culture of future Kwinana port operations.
